## ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS TO ERAS APPLICATION Academic Year 2025-2026\*

# The Department of Psychiatry accepts applications from graduates of LCME-accredited Schools of Medicine

## 1. Personal Statement in Spanish

In addition to the English version submitted through ERAS, candidates must submit a Personal Statement in Spanish via email to <a href="mailto:psychiatrycoordinator.rcm@upr.edu">psychiatrycoordinator.rcm@upr.edu</a>.

#### 2. Official Transcripts\*\*

One <u>official</u> transcript, including cumulative average grade point (GPA), from both Undergraduate and Medical School must be submitted.

#### 3. Letters of Recommendation

Three letters of recommendation are required. It is highly recommended that at least one letter be written by a supervisor from a clinical rotation. Applicants who graduated more than one year prior to application must also submit a letter from the most recent employment or clinical work experience supervisor.

#### 4. USMLE Requirements

Official evidence of passing USMLE Step 1 and Step 2 CK must be submitted.

Step 2 CK must be passed no later than two (2) weeks before the NRMP ranking deadline which is March 4, 2026.

#### 5. NRMP Registration

Applicants must provide <u>official</u> evidence of registration with the National Residency Matching Program (NRMP). Please send this confirmation to: <u>psychiatrycoordinator.rcm@upr.edu</u>.

## 6. Language Requirement

Candidates must be fully bilingual in Spanish and English, with fluency in speaking, reading, comprehension, and writing in both languages.

#### 7. Additional Requirements for PGY-II Applicants

Candidates applying for PGY-II entry must also include:

- a) A letter of recommendation, in English, from the current Training Program Director, specifying the clinical rotations and exact dates of each rotation completed during the PGY-1 training.
- b) <u>Official</u> evidence of having passed all USMLE parts (Step 1, Step 2 CK, and Step 3). Each part can be taken a maximum of four (4) times, prior to the start of residency.



## ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS TO ERAS APPLICATION Academic Year 2025-2026\*

The Department of Psychiatry accepts applications from graduates of international medical schools that are recognized by the Puerto Rico Board of Medical Examiners and listed by the World Health Organization (WHO).

#### 1. Visa Requirement

Non-U.S. citizens must hold a valid J-1 or H-1B visa.

#### 2. Medical School Recognition

Official evidence that your international medical school is approved and recognized by the *Junta de Licenciamiento y Disciplina Médica de Puerto Rico* (Puerto Rico Board of Medical Examiners). Verification can be accessed at <a href="https://orcps.salud.gov.pr">https://orcps.salud.gov.pr</a>.

#### 3. Personal Statement in Spanish

In addition to the English version submitted through ERAS, candidates must submit a Personal Statement in Spanish via email to <a href="mailto:psychiatrycoordinator.rcm@upr.edu">psychiatrycoordinator.rcm@upr.edu</a>.

#### 4. Official Transcripts\*\*

One <u>official</u> transcript, including the cumulative average grade point (GPA), from both Undergraduate and Medical School must be submitted.

#### 5. Letters of Recommendation

Three letters of recommendation are required. It is highly recommended that at least one letter be written by a supervisor from a clinical rotation. #### 6. ECFMG Certification and USMLE Requirements

- a) Candidates must hold a currently valid ECFMG certificate and provide <u>official</u> evidence of passing USMLE Step 1 and Step 2 CK.
- b) Step 2 CK must be passed no later than **two (2) weeks before** the NRMP ranking deadline which is **March 4, 2026**.

#### 7. NRMP Registration

Applicants must provide <u>official</u> evidence of registration with the National Residency Matching Program (NRMP). Please send this confirmation to: <u>psychiatrycoordinator.rcm@upr.edu</u>.

#### 8. Language Requirement

Candidates must be fully bilingual in Spanish and English, with fluency in speaking, reading, comprehension, and writing in both languages.
