## ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS TO ERAS APPLICATION Academic Year 2017-2018\*

The Department of Psychiatry accepts applications of Graduates from International Medical Schools (Recognized by the Puerto Rico Board of Medical Examination and as listed by the World Health Organization):

- 1. If Candidate is not a USA Citizen, he/she must have J-1 or H-1B Visa permit.
- 2. Personal Statement in Spanish (in addition to English version). Please send Personal Statement in Spanish to <a href="mailto:zoraida.perez@upr.edu">zoraida.perez@upr.edu</a>
- 3. Two <u>official</u> College Transcripts (with your cumulative average grade point-GPA).
- 4. <u>Official</u> evidence that your International Medical School is approved and recognized by the "Junta de Licenciamiento y Disciplina Médica de Puerto Rico (JLDMPR)" (Puerto Rico Board of Medical Examiners). <a href="http://www.salud.gov.pr/Programas/ORCPS/JLDMPR">http://www.salud.gov.pr/Programas/ORCPS/JLDMPR</a> (787) 999-8989 and the WHO.
- 5. <u>Official</u> copy of your Diploma of Medical School\*\*
- 6. It is highly recommended that among the three letters of recommendation, at least one should be from a clinical rotation supervisor. (a) Candidates who graduate more than one year prior to the application must submit a letter of recommendation from most recent employment/clinical work experience.
- 7. Compliance with the UPR-School of Medicine Graduate Medical Education Office requirements\*\*

- 8. Official documentation of provisional or permanent License to practice Medicine in Puerto Rico\*\*
- 9. Compliance with ECFMG currently valid certificate and completion of USMLE Part I and Part II. (a) The Candidate must have approved the USMLE-Step II CK and CS no later than two weeks before the NRMP ranking closing date (**February 22, 2017**). (b) The Candidate must not have taken any of the USMLE Parts more than three (3) times to be eligible for interview.
- 10. Approval of the USMLE 3 is a requirement in order to be promoted to the PGY II level of training and can't be taken more than three times. Residents who fail the exam **must apply and re-take the exam** within 60 days. It must be approved not later than May 31 of the PGY I. The exam and all part of the USMLE can be taken a maximum of three (3) times. If there is no space available to take it in PR, it is the responsibility of the Resident to take it in other examination site with space available. Official evidence that he/she has applied must be presented to Program Director.
- 11. Fully bilingual Spanish/English (Fluency in speaking, reading, comprehension and writing in both languages).
- 12. <u>Official</u> Evidence of the Registration for the National Residency Matching Program. Please send evidence to <u>zoraida.perez@upr.edu</u>
- 13. PGY II level candidates applying in Psychiatry must also include: (a) a letter of recommendation written in English from the Training Director of the Program stating the clinical rotations and exact dates of each clinical rotation completed during the PGY I training level; (b) official evidence of having approved all USMLE parts. Each part of the USMLE cannot be taken more than three times.
