COURSE DESCRIPTION: A COURSE ON COMPARATIVE CARDIOVASCULAR PHYSIOLOGY BASED ON SOME OF THE MOST RECENT ADVANCES IN THE

FIELD. THE COURSE INCLUDES HEART MECHANICS, ELECTROPHYSIOLOGY, HEMODYNAMICS AND REGULATION.

COURSE OBJECTIVES AND EXPECTED OUTCOMES:

- 1. TO REVIEW THE BASICS CONCEPTS OF CARDIAC AND VASCULAR PHYSIOLOGY.
- 2. TO SEARCH THE LITERATURE FOR THE MOST RECENT ADVANCES IN THE FOLLOWING SPECIFIC AREAS.
 - A. THE HEART AS A MECHANICAL PUMP.
 - B. STRUCTURAL FUNCTIONAL ORGANIZATION OF THE HEART.
 - C. ELECTROPHYSIOLOGY OF THE FAST AND SLOW CARDIAC FIBERS.
 - D. REGULATION OF CARDIAC MUSCLE PERFORMANCE.
 - E. NEURAL AND HORMONAL CONTROL OF THE HEART.
 - F. HEART HEMODYNAMICS
 - G. THE PHYSIOLOGY OF HEART FAILURE.
- 3. TO USE THE LITERATURE AS A MEANS TO DISCUSS EACH OF THE AFOREMENTIONED AREAS IN A PAPER DISCUSSION FORMAT.
- 4. TO PREPARE A PAPER PRESENTATION FOR DISCUSSION WITH THE GROUP OR THE PROFESSOR.

The students should provide proficiency with the course objectives, that will be measured by analysis, integration and comparison of the above mentioned concepts, that will be evaluated through multiple choice questions, essay exams, term papers, presentations and/or publications.

COURSE TOPICS AND TIME DISTRIBUTION:

- A. THE HEART AS A MECHANICAL PUMP.
- B. STRUCTURAL FUNCTIONAL ORGANIZATION OF THE HEART.
- C. ELECTROPHYSIOLOGY OF THE FAST AND SLOW CARDIAC FIBERS.
- D. REGULATION OF CARDIAC MUSCLE PERFORMANCE.
- E. NEURAL AND HORMONAL CONTROL OF THE HEART.
- F. HEART HEMODYNAMICS.
- G. THE PHYSIOLOGY OF HEART FAILURE.

TEACHING STRATEGIES:

THE MAIN TEACHING STRATEGY FOR THIS COURSE IS ACTIVE GROUP DISCUSSION AND PAPER PRESENTATIONS.

ESSENTIAL REQUIREMENTS:

THE COURSE REQUIRES THAT THE STUDENT HAS ALREADY PASSED THE BASIC GRADUATE PHYSIOLOGY COURSE IN GOOD STANDING. CLASS ATTENDANCE IS ALSO REQUIRED.

THE COURSE WILL BE EVALUATED THROUGH THE STUDENT PRESENTATIONS OF SPECIFIC ASSIGNED PAPERS.
